# The phrase structure rules of Grammar 5

#### For sentences:

$$\begin{bmatrix} \textit{phrase} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{sentence} \end{bmatrix} \rightarrow \begin{bmatrix} \textit{word} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{noun} \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} \textit{word} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \begin{bmatrix} \textit{verb} \\ \textit{RIGHT} & \lozenge \end{bmatrix} \end{bmatrix}$$
 
$$\begin{bmatrix} \textit{phrase} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{sentence} \end{bmatrix} \rightarrow \begin{bmatrix} \textit{word} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{noun} \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} \textit{phrase} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{verb} \end{bmatrix}$$

### For verb phrases:

$$\begin{bmatrix} \textit{phrase} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{verb} \end{bmatrix} \rightarrow \begin{bmatrix} \textit{word} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \begin{bmatrix} \textit{verb} \\ \textit{RIGHT} & \boxed{1} \end{bmatrix} \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} \textit{word} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \boxed{1} \end{bmatrix}$$

The last rule says: a verb phrase consists of a verb word that wants the category C after it + a word of that same category C.

# Two tiny changes (in red) to rule 1 and rule 3

#### For sentences:

$$\begin{bmatrix} \textit{phrase} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{sentence} \end{bmatrix} \rightarrow \begin{bmatrix} \textit{word} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{noun} \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} \textit{word} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \begin{bmatrix} \textit{verb} \\ \textit{RIGHT} \langle \rangle \end{bmatrix} \end{bmatrix}$$
 
$$\begin{bmatrix} \textit{phrase} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{sentence} \end{bmatrix} \rightarrow \begin{bmatrix} \textit{word} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{noun} \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} \textit{phrase} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{verb} \end{bmatrix}$$

### For verb phrases:



The last rule says: a verb phrase consists of a verb word that wants the category C after it + a word of that same category C.

## But, once we do that, we no longer need rule 2

Phrase structure rule for sentences:

$$\begin{bmatrix} \textit{phrase} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{sentence} \end{bmatrix} \quad \rightarrow \quad \begin{bmatrix} \textit{word} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \textit{noun} \end{bmatrix} \begin{bmatrix} \textit{word} \\ \textit{SYNTAX} & \begin{bmatrix} \textit{verb} \\ \textit{RIGHT} \ \\ \end{pmatrix} \end{bmatrix}$$

Phrase structure rule for verb phrases:



The last rule says: a verb phrase consists of a verb word that wants the category C after it + a word of that same category C.
